

SOWMA's first tutoring site was the David Jon Louison Family Shelter in Brockton, Massachusetts. Today our tutoring model includes not only family shelters, but community centers, transitional housing and more recently, hotels.

We couldn't do our work without the heart and dedication of our Tutoring Program volunteers, who come from a variety of backgrounds and professions to champion a child in need. We have a part-time position available as a coordinator of tutors, students and partners at two Boston locations, Brighton and Dorchester.


